exceptionally well and we continue to receive encouraging reports of their progress.


• We just received the great news that 24 of the LICC nursing students began their Clinical Rotations on November 18. This is the very first batch of students that have completed all the requirements to be registered with the Liberia Board of Nursing & Midwifery and we are so proud of them and look forward to how God will use them in the future to change Liberia.

- LICC statistics for Semester 2 The total enrollment of 452 students was down a little from past semesters since many nursing students needed to complete some necessary requirements before they could be fully enrolled in our Nursing Program. The Business Department at 207 students and Agriculture Department at 122 continue to be the largest areas of study at the college, with the Education Department at 76 students, Nursing Department at 36 and the Theology Department with 17 students.
- The LICC-Work-Study Program led by Pastor Rich Johnston continues to make a transformative impact on 30 students' lives each semester. We are greatly encouraged that the Student Intern Leader for the program has been able to make great progress in making changes that not only benefit the Work Study students, but also the college.
- Russ & Ruth Schwartz returned to the LICC campus in late October for 6 weeks. They continue their exceptional efforts to strengthen academic quality and the learning



- LICC urgently needs a 12–18 seat van or bus to transport nursing students to and from clinical sites, as required by the Liberian Board of Nursing and Midwifery. The bus we currently have has been in use for well over 12 years and isn't reliable enough to do the job. The estimated cost is \$20,000–\$30,000, or if we receive a donated vehicle in the U.S., we will arrange the shipment to Liberia. If you might know of such a vehicle, please let us know as soon as possible. Please join us in praying for God's provision to meet this important need.
- We are blessed that generous donors have offered a matching grant of \$50,000 toward the construction of the second floor of the Nursing Building at LICC. We have one year to match this amount. If successful, ULICAF will have \$100,000 available for both construction and needed repairs. We kindly ask for your continued support to help us fully match this grant within the next 12 months.
- Finally, recognizing the shortage of qualified healthcare providers in Liberia, LICC hopes to expand its nursing program by introducing Midwifery and Nurse Practitioner specialties. This initiative will require significant resources, but we trust that if it is God's will, He will provide the means to bring it to fruition.

These are some extremely big goals for the coming year, but we all serve a much BIGGER God!
